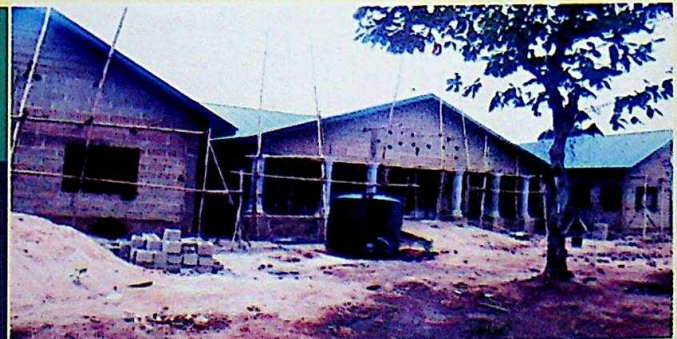

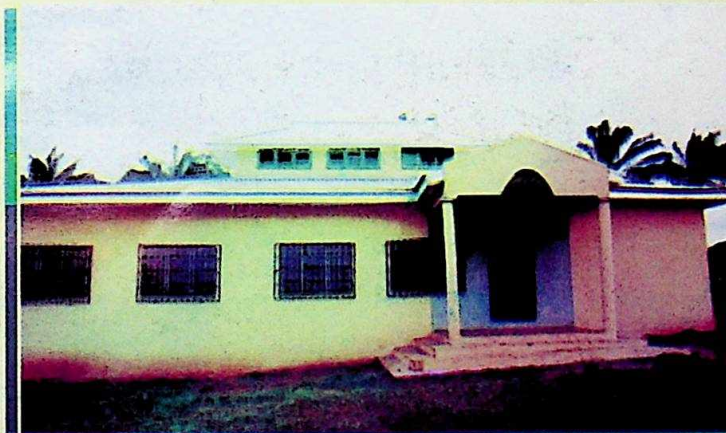

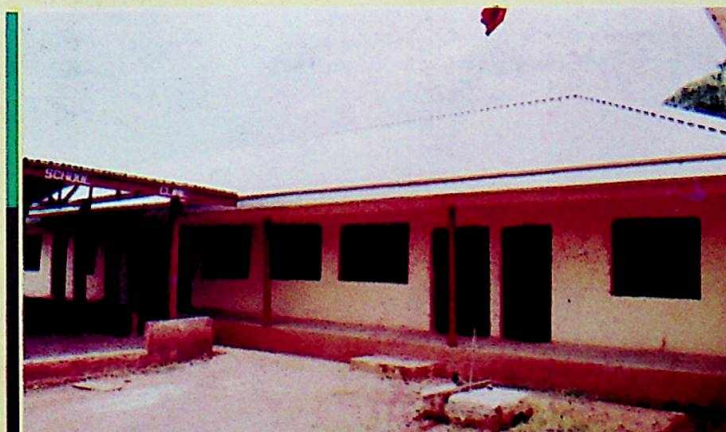

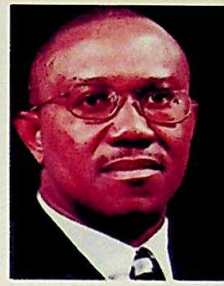

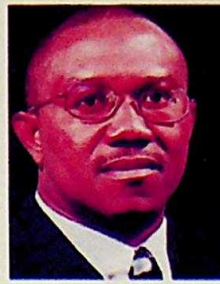

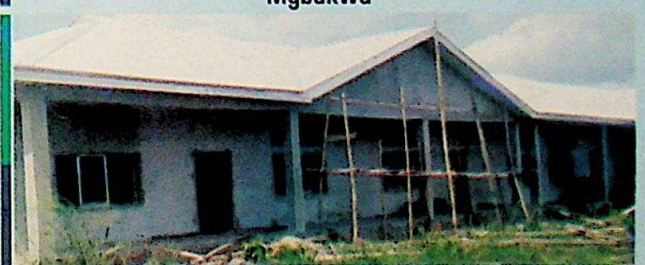

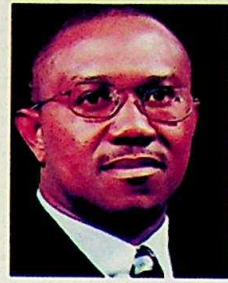

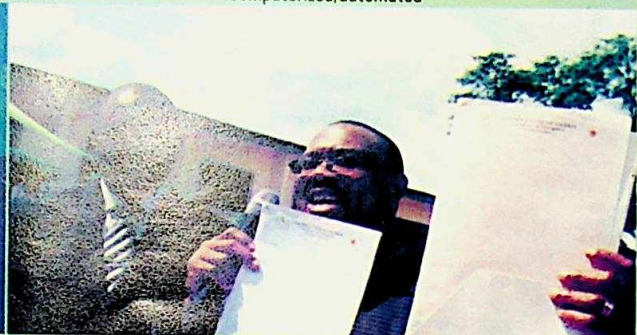

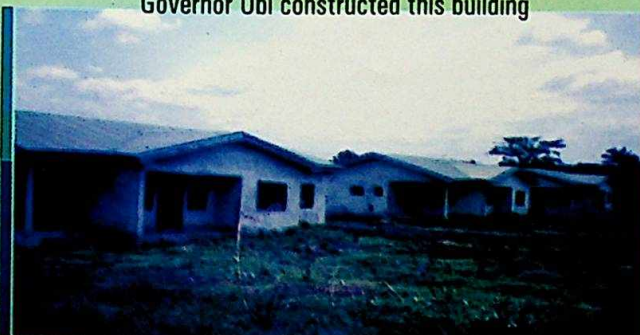

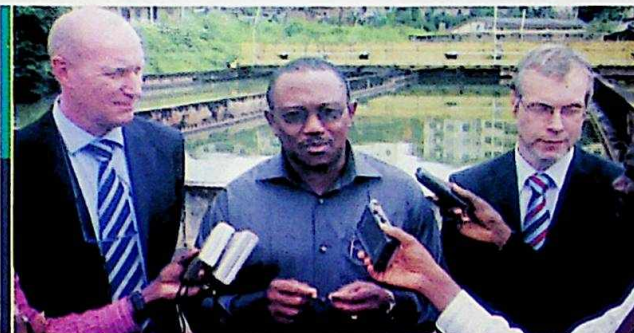

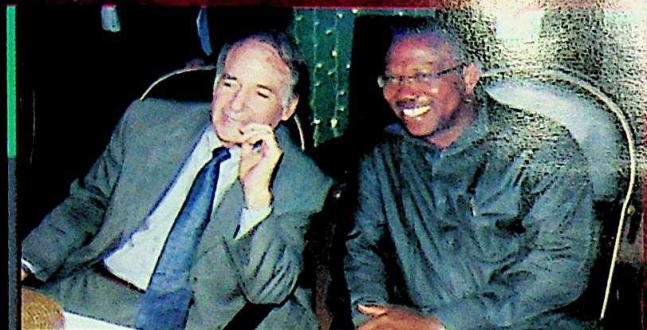

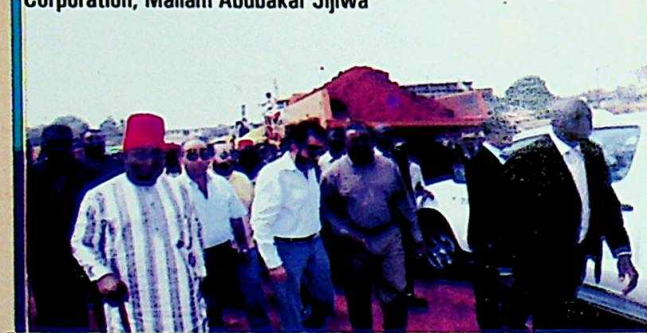

- When the 2007 elections approached, a lot of intrigues were orchestrated to stop him. Not known to descend to the level of political rascality, he again opted for due process and went back to the courts for the interpretation of his tenure, having been sworn in on the 17th of March, 2006.

- In spite of interruptions and distractions, Gov. Obi has refused to be distracted; rather he is striding on relentlessly with the task of the integrated development of Anambra State. Tactically, he has been able to moderate all tendencies even those on the lunatic fringe. Besides his aides, that get agitated when certain characters go to extremes, he even tolerate people claiming his projects as theirs.
- On resumption of office, he quickly embarked on massive road construction in an organized and strategic manner, executing in three years a total of 350kms of asphalted roads out of the over 658kms awarded, the highest by any previous Governor in the State. At the same time, unlike under any other previous Governor, other sectors are receiving attention in accordance with ANIDS.
- What has distinguished him from some other Governors is his sense of justice and fairness in taking development to every part of the State. He is, for example, the first Governor that has started the construction of a road in Anambra West Local Government Area- Umueze Anam-Mmiata Road.
- He has got Onitsha General Hospital and other health institutions in the State accredited by relevant bodies; he has, in three years, completed the first phase of the imposing State Secretariat and has started the second phase; he has started the massive physical development of the State university, and other educational institutions at all levels; he has brought peace and security to the State as testified by security agencies. He has reinvigorated commerce and industry in the State, such that the Central Bank, the Standard Organizations of Nigeria, Corporate Affairs Commission, the Stock Exchange and other organizations are opening shop in the State. Even the International Agencies are finding the State attractive again.
- As a result of his political odyssey rooted in perseverance and maturity, his close friends, in spite of his rejection of honorific titles, now call him **Okwute**, the rock upon which Anambra State is being re-built.
- Indeed, he has taken the state to another level, away from rascals that used to control the destiny of the State.

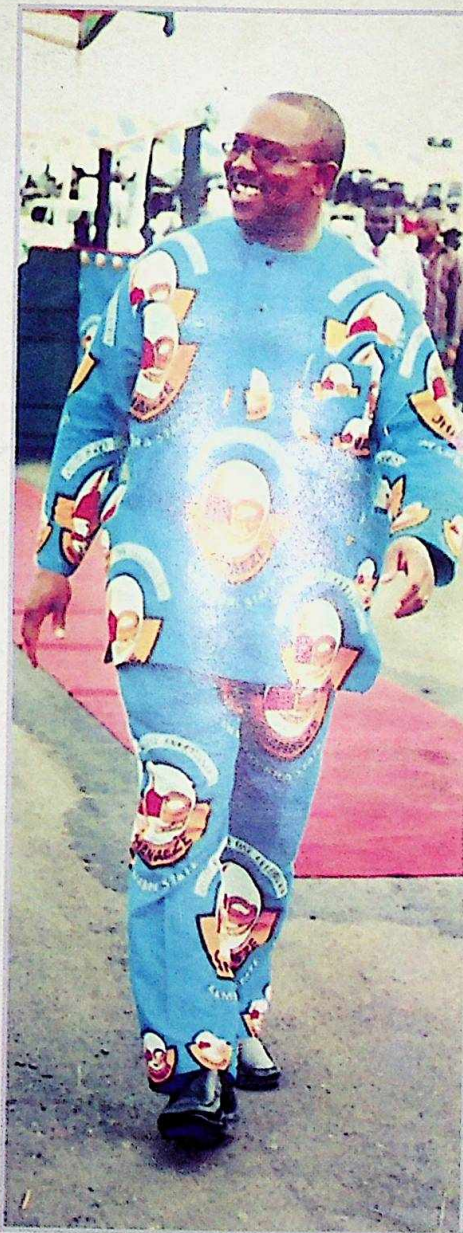
